MOOGHAUN COUNTY CLARE

During work to build the railway line at this point in 1854, a significant gold hoard was unearthed. It is now referred to as the Mooghaun Hoard. Several items are to be seen in the National Museum, while the British Museum has several more. The find was the largest ever in these islands but its true extent remains a mystery as many of the items were melted down locally or in Limerick before the importance of the find was realised.

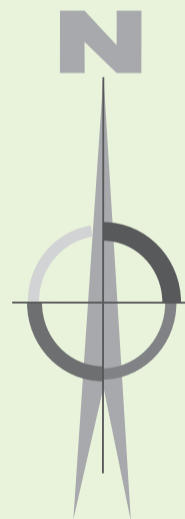
